As I have shared many times in my newsletters, the Costa Rican evangelical church in general has been quite opposed to historic Christianity in general, and Reformed theology in particular. Pentecostalism and later Neo-pentecostalism has influenced a great majority of churches, even some that in the past were somewhat traditional (Baptist, Methodist, Biblical churches). So we Reformed churches have just plodded along

preaching, teaching, and awaiting the Lord's time for things to change. At times I despaired of ever seeing improvement!

But then things started to happen. Little by little we Reformed folks were invited to speak at more and more pastors' associations. We have been able to take special speakers to various events. And more and more evangelical leaders have attended our own courses and

They are inviting an arminian and a calvinist to discuss the differences (something unthinkable before). And even more unthinkable (to me!) was that I would be invited! Of course, I gladly accepted, and I look forward to sharing the glories of the

Gospel as understood by our Reformed confessions. Many have an erroneous view of Calvinism, and I pray that my time with the pastors will be very profitable. But I want to ask for **prayer.** I am scheduled to speak around the middle of October.

Conference on biblical worship

Weak theology will produce aberrations in practice. Aberrations in practice in turn contribute to more bad theology. Many evangelical churches (even some Reformed ones!) have absorbed music and liturgies that over emphasize the sentimental, the individual vs. the Church as community, and contribute to what some have called the "feminization" of the Church.

Pastor Orlando García comes out of a radical Pentecostal background. But God

has been leading him for many years to read the history of the Church, as well as good theology. Some years ago we met, and he began attending our conferences and courses, and Reforming his church! Today he has virtually completed a full transformation of the congregation. It hasn't been without cost, however, and at one point 35 members left the congregation, disgruntled over the changes.

Pastor García has invited me to give a full day's conference on biblical principles of worship. I've written a small booklet exploring the implications of "covenant" for worship. We believe that we are a covenant people, God is a covenanting God, and our Sunday worship is a sacred, covenant meeting between our Sovereign and His people according to God's measures. These truths give the Sunday worship service a depth and significance that many churches ignore. So the conference has been opened up to the public, and the church is putting on the lunch and coffee breaks.

For the conference I will be offering not only biblical material, but we will also analyze common "worship songs" that present severe problems for public worship. Please **pray** that God will use this opportunity to help other pastors, and that they won't feel offended, but rather encouraged by Scripture.

Discouragement

We live and serve in a fallen world, with personal weaknesses and differences. My wife and I have also seen how the Devil sometimes waits for just the right opportunity, and over virtually nothing is able to create huge conflicts.
