2014 Ministry Activities

*Theological conferences * 34 in all! With virtually no expense! (See Financial Report)

International

- 7 conferences were held in Colombia, Panama, Mexico, Uruguay and Nicaragua
- 8 conference speakers participated
- At our General Assembly we had various conferences, 15 countries were represented and 65 church leaders were present.

- CLIR sponsored 27 conferences

- The YouTube channel went from 11 subscribers to 145


* Income saw a nice increase for the CLIR budget from Latin America *

- \$6,914 were received from **donations in Latin America**


More news!

* News from the Tepeyac Christian School *

- The school Association just voted almost unanimously to make a push to finish the high school construction. They are asking for volunteers, and the financial help necessary to advance. Please consider helping get the building finished so it can be put to use!
- Some rumors have been circulated that the Tepeyac school does not need the high school building. This is false. Right now there is not enough room for all the sections, and the Principal would like to add *more* English and Bible sections / levels.
- While we are on the "rumors", some rumors have circulated that the building is structurally unsafe. This also is false. There is a plastered Styrofoam wall that should be reinforced (although it already withstood a 7.1 earthquake just fine!), and regular maintenance of the structural joints of steel and concrete continued. But the basic structure of the building is more than sound. We have already had two major earthquakes and many strong tremors, and there are no structural cracks to be seen whatsoever.
- Another rumor has circulated that up to \$500,000 has been squandered on waste. Such reckless comments have no factual basis. Since the construction has been a long process of 13 years, we must admit that there has been wasted material in sand and concrete washed away by rain, or gone bad before use. We have also had a violent robbery at gun-point which took many of our best tools, as well as other robberies by some of our own employees. Such losses, however, have been more than offset by the many volunteers who donated professional expertise and/ or willing bodies toward labor.
